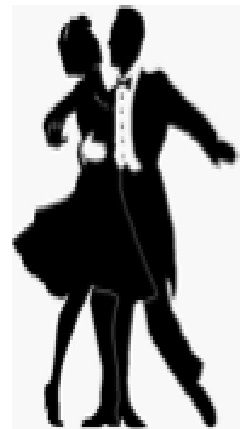

April 2012 Veterans Message: Medal of Valor given to families of the fallen in War on Terror

The Medal of Valor was designed to be given to families of those who have made the supreme sacrifice in our War on Terror. The purpose of the medal is to give our Lodges the opportunity to honor these individuals who have served in our military defending our country and our freedoms.

It is a way for all of our Members to let these brave families know that we as an organization will never forget the sacrifice that their loved ones have made. Small as it may be, it shows that we appreciate our country and the freedoms that their loved one has given to us through his/her service and loss of life in our military.

The medals are made in the United States and come with a presentation case. The front of the medal is engraved with "Operation Enduring Freedom" on top and "Operation Iraqi Freedom" on the bottom. The back of the medal is suitable for engraving the name of the deceased Veteran and also states "Presented by the Grand Lodge of the B.P.O. Elks to the family of (Name) in recognition of their supreme sacrifice." The cost is \$8 per medal, which includes shipping fees.

As Elks, if you know a family in your area that has lost a loved one, you should have your Lodge step forward and arrange a presentation to honor the memory of the person lost in this War on Terror. Just contact the Elks National Veterans Service Commission at 2750 N. Lakeview Ave., Chicago, IL 60614, at (773) 755-4736 or Vets@elks.org to order your medal(s), and we will promptly ship them to you.

This is one of the most important meaningful programs that we can put forward into our communities to show our support and belief in our military.

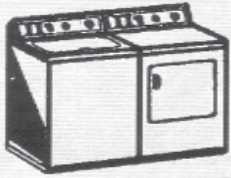
